Maria first applied for a Habitat home in 1997, four years after moving to Boston from Puerto Rico. Her three children (Noelia, 18; Javier, 14; and Michael, 12) and her grandchild (Felix, 15 months) were living with her at the time. Maria worked two jobs—at Burger King and Sky Chef—to make ends meet. She was 42 years old.

Supporters like you came together with funding to build a four-unit, two-building condominium on Quincy Street in Dorchester. Maria was approved for a three-bedroom unit in that development. The rest, as they say, is history.

When asked during the interview process in 1997, "How long do you intend to live in a Habitat home?" Maria responded, "For a very long time!"
